7 MUST-SHOOT MOMENTS

The difference between a good picture and a great one is a talented photographer being in the right place at the right moment. We've seen thousands of wedding pictures, and there are a few moments that never fail to be beautiful. Here's what to ask your photographer for. **BY LEIGH CRANDALL**

The "Reveal": If you have your portraits taken before the ceremony, you can set up the moment you first see each other that day as an event.
